Going Strong with the New Jersey Natural Gas Advantage

By now, you may have noticed we changed the name of our newsletter to the New Jersey Natural Gas Advantage. It symbolizes the commitment we have for excellent customer service and builds on the stand-alone “leaf N” logo that signifies the very things you, our customers, have come to expect from us – “trust, reliability and value.” So, thank you for choosing the New Jersey Natural Gas Advantage.

Attention to Safety: Inspect Your Piping

NJNG owns and maintains the natural gas pipelines and the service lines leading up to your natural gas meter. However, safety does not stop at the meter. It is the homeowner’s responsibility to inspect and maintain the piping from the outlet of the natural gas meter to your natural gas appliances and equipment. These pipes can include fuel lines – both inside and outside your home or business – and buried lines leading to outdoor appliances (such as a grill) or remote structures. Follow these safety tips for customer-owned piping to help prevent possible damage to your property:

Have a licensed professional locate and inspect the buried natural gas lines originating from your meter and leading to your appliances and equipment. Keep a copy of the diagram for future use.

Periodically inspect for leaks, corrosion and damage to your piping and equipment. When necessary, have a licensed professional make repairs immediately.

State law requires that all excavators, including homeowners, business owners and contractors, call 811 or 800-272-1000 for a free markout of underground public utility lines at least three business days prior to any planned excavation. Please remind any contractor or landscaper you hire that by LAW they MUST call for this markout. An NJNG contractor will mark out the service line that comes from the natural gas main to your meter. However, customer installed lines such as sprinkler systems, invisible fencing or low-voltage lighting, are not marked by our contractor. So, before digging near buried piping, be sure to use caution and hand locate the piping in advance and then dig by hand.
